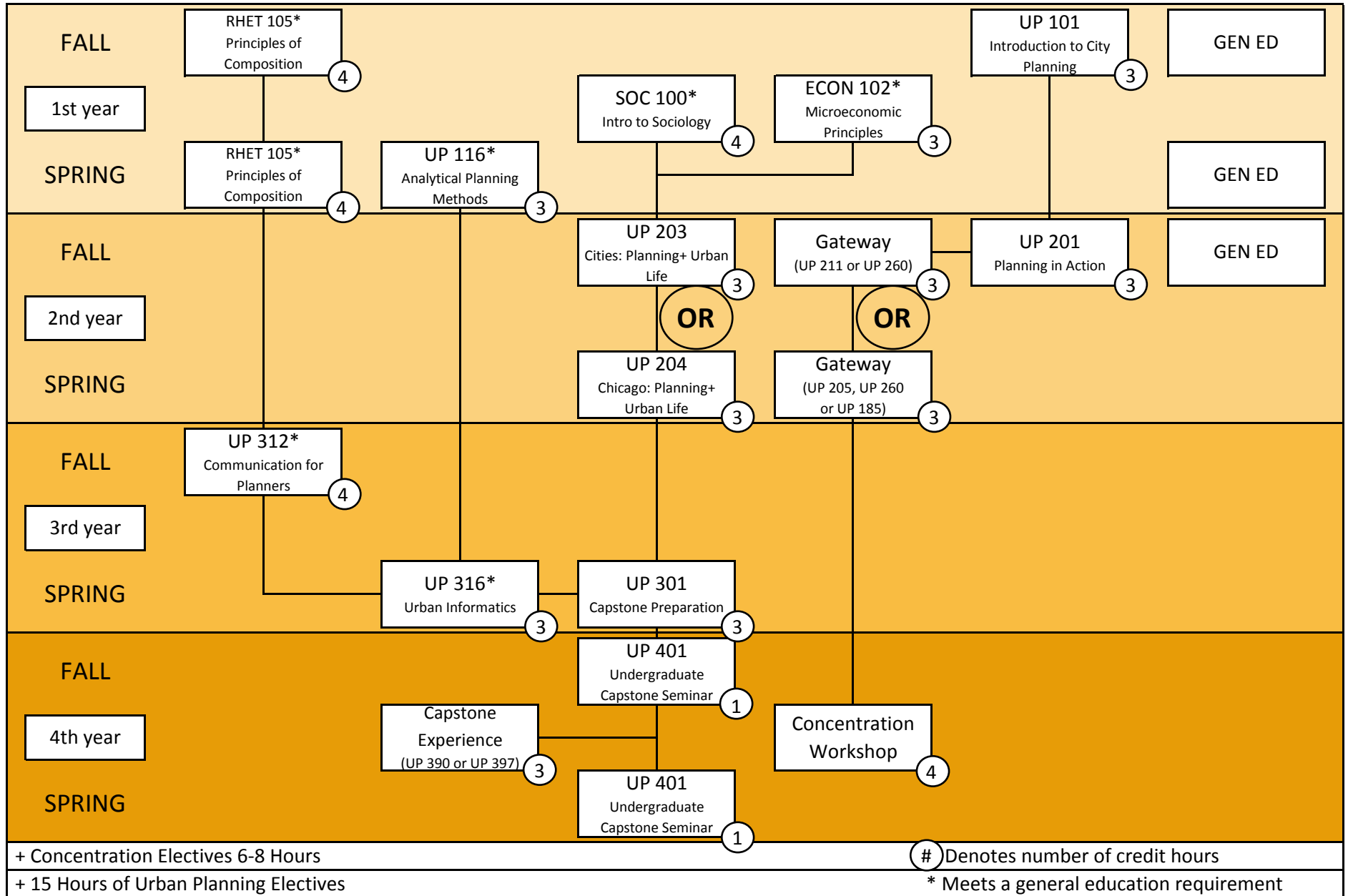


BAUSP Program Incoming Freshman Core Curriculum

General Education requirements which are NOT met through Urban Planning requirements:

Natural Sciences & Technology, 3 credit hours or 6 credit hours if UP 205 not taken

Humanities & the Arts, 6 credit hours

Cultural Studies: Non-Western/U.S. Minority Culture, 3 credit hours

Cultural Studies: Western/Comparative Culture, 3 credit hours (unless UP 185 is taken)

General Education Language Requirement

Successful completion, in high school, or the third year of a language other than English; successfully completing a third-semester college-level course in a language other than English; or demonstrating proficiency at the third semester level in a language proficiency exam approved by the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the appropriate department.

Concentrations require:

- A gateway course;
- 6-8 credit hours of concentration electives; and
- A concentration workshop.

Capstone

- Students are required to take UP 301/Capstone Preparation their junior spring semester. Meetings with concentration advisors are required; students submit their capstone proposal at the end of the semester.
- In their senior year, students enroll in fall and spring semesters of UP 401/Capstone Seminar. Students will attend lectures and workshops about career opportunities, resume writing, interviewing, and networking. Meets on a monthly basis. This course includes preparation of the capstone and presentation.
